Intel will begin publishing Product Change Notifications, Product Discontinuance Notifications, and Product Support Notifications to RDC on January 22, 2024.

Historical change notifications have been migrated from QDMS to RDC and will be searchable and viewable from the RDC Product Change Notification page and we encourage accessing content from this page. No notifications have been sent from RDC for migrated content. Customers will not receive Bookmark notifications for PCNs until new content is published to RDC.

The decision to transition to Resource & Documentation Center (RDC) stems from our commitment to deliver the best possible service to our valued customers. RDC offers a range of new features and enhancements that will greatly benefit Intel customer's PCN needs.

Customer Impact of Change and Recommended Action:

Once this transition has been completed QDMS will no longer be accessible and all notifications will be accessed via the RDC Product Change Communication page (https://www.intel.com/content/www/us/en/collections/content-type/pcns.html).

Key points regarding the transition of notifications from QDMS to RDC:

- Historical notifications will be available on RDC once the QDMS site is disabled.
- Historical PCNs will be searchable using keywords, Ordering Codes, MMIDs, and legacy PCN numbers.
- Notifications published to RDC will have new numbering but will be searchable using new PCN numbers, MMIDs, and Keywords.
- Once QDMS has been decommissioned, redirect links will be in place to route QDMS related links to the Product Change Communication page within RDC. This includes the QDMS landing page and content specific links.
- Specific job aids are included within this communication. These job aids will detail setting up a RDC profile, logging on to the RDC site, navigating to the Product Change Notification content collection on RDC, searching for notifications, bookmarking content type and documents, and managing content which will enable email notifications.
